

Beginning Fitness, PE 7th grade: Students will learn the basics of physical fitness and participate in activities that will help foster the knowledge and desire to stay physically active. Students will be expected to pass a physical fitness test that measures their ability to master activities that are practiced.

US Government and Citizenship, 12th grade: Students will study the different ideas and influences that led to the creation of the US Constitution. Students will also study the basic structure of the Constitution and understand the relationship between the three branches of government, along with the relationship between the federal government and state governments. Modern issues that our government deals with today will also be studied. Students will be expected to pass the Utah Civics Exam with a minimum score of 80%.

Ancient/Modern World Civilization, 10th grade: Students will study both early and modern world civilizations and understand the factors that shape world cultures and civilizations. Particular attention will be given to the civilizations of ancient Greece and Rome, ancient American Civilizations, the Middle Ages, Islamic civilizations of the Middle East, and modern civilizations. Students will also be able to recognize and understand patterns and factors that shape cultures and civilizations today. Students will be required to participate in the school History Fair. Students will also be expected to pass the Utah Civics Exam with a score of at least 80%.
